The Paranormal Show added to K.L. Winter Carnival

The Kirkland Lake Festivals Committee has added an additional live show for the upcoming Winter Carnival. The Paranormal Show is Friday, February 17 in the Northern College Auditorium.

The Paranormal Show features Scott McClelland, the man behind Canada's premiere circus sideshow 'Carnival Diablo.' Loaded with audience participation, the 90-minute show is an exciting look at all facets of the unexplainable.

McClelland's show includes hypnotism, mind-reading, psychokinesis (the movement of objects with the mind), auto-suggestion, retrocognition, a game of Russian roulette with a 9-inch spike, and an attempt to make contact with the dead.

Due to the content of the show, this live performance is recommended for ages 13 years and older only. The Paranormal Show has been showcased on The Discovery Channel, TLC, and A&E.

Tickets for The Paranormal Show are \$10 advance at reception at the Community Complex and are also available online through the Kirkland Lake Festival Committee's website.

Kirkland Lake's 18-day Winter Carnival begins with the CJKL Carnival Queen Crowning and Fashion Show on Thursday, February 16. Other events include Kabaret, the skating club's ice show, hockey tournament, kids carnival, and a yuk yuk's comedy night.

The February 18th Chantal Kreviazuk concert is sold out. The following night, the Stars of Pop perform at the Kids Winter Jam in the gymnasium at Northern College.

The \$50,000 Alamos Gold Fish Derby is Saturday, February 25 on Otto Lake at Culver Park. Ticket packages include an adult entry to the fish

derby, an entry in the \$5,000 elimination draw and admission to a pub featuring the all-female AC\DC tribute, Hell's Belles.
